Families may be asked to complete a survey evaluating the Title I school-wide program.
Parents/Guardians may request professional qualifications of their child's teacher(s) and paraprofessional(s)

Parents/Guardians will be notified if their child is being served for four or more consecutive weeks by an individual who does not meet North Carolina's state licensure requirements North Carolina Department of Public Instruction has identified Hanford Dole Elementary as a Target Support and Improvement School.
